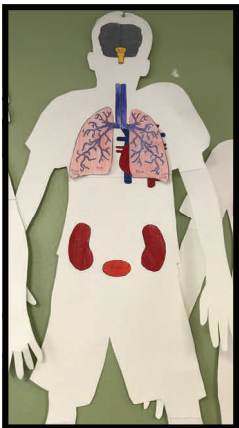

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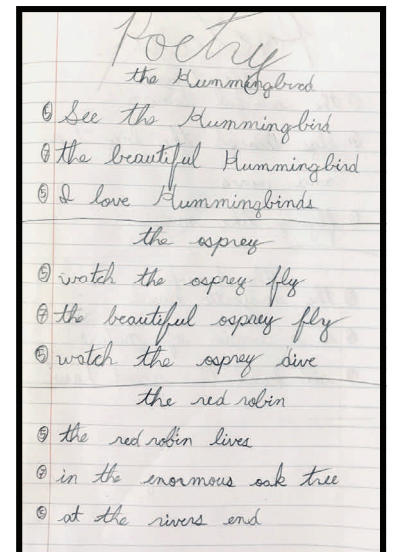

This week we had an anatomy lesson on the urinary system. The students learned that our kidneys act like a filtration unit for the body. Blood is filtered through the kidneys, and vitamins, minerals, and hormones are kept in the blood, while waste products are sent to the bladder as urine. The kidneys also maintain the balance of fluids in our bodies to keep us healthy. This week's calculation challenge was: If you produce one liter of urine each day, how much have you produced so far? Our collection of second selves is really starting to shape up as more and more body parts are added each week.



Maria Montessori said, "Imagination does not become great until human beings, given the courage and the strength, use it to create." We had an opportunity to give a poetry lesson about the Haiku, a three-line poem with this

structure: five syllables, seven syllables, and five syllables. The children were then able to create their very own Haiku poem, with some students becoming inspired to create many more. They were all so beautiful to read.



In our early human studies, we had a lesson on Australopithecus afarensis, better known as "Lucy". This most famous early human ancestor lived 3.2 million years ago. With the mixed features of both human and ape, the difference with Lucy was that she had the spine, pelvis, and leg and foot bones for walking upright.
