





E2 Zoom Activities

We witnessed the students helping each other figure out how to insert pictures and videos into their slide shows and generally encouraging one another. We all learned so much about a lovely variety of subjects.

In Art, we examined the life and work of artist Vincent Van Gogh. We took a wonderful virtual tour of the Van Gogh Museum in Amsterdam with a series of videos. The students were then able to create their own versions of a Van Gogh painting of their choosing.
