Over the weekend our school put mulch on the playground. We are all enjoying the change.


Christian is using the Spindle Box. One of the purposes of this activity is to introduce the concept of zero and its symbol.




Meher is using her finger to trace the shapes of one of the drawers of the Geometric Cabinet. One of the purposes of this material is to isolate visual distinctions between forms.
