

Dear Parents,

Welcome, or welcome back to Center Montessori School – Primary 1 classroom! I am looking forward to working with you and your child this school year and have included a few things to help us have a great start to our year:

Calendar & Schedule

If you are new to our classroom, I invite you to attend our Zoom New Parent Orientation on August 13, from 7p.m. to 8pm. This is a chance to meet with me and my other fellow Primary teachers for an informative session regarding our procedures and specific classroom guidelines to better assist you and your child. We also invite all of our families to our annual Ice Cream Social on Sunday, August 15, from 1pm to 3pm. Please also mark your calendars for your child's in person orientation days scheduled on *Thursday, August 12, from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. and Friday, August 13, from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.* These two days are only for children new to our classroom and will help facilitate his/her transition to the Montessori Primary environment.

As we are all excited about starting the school year in person, I am confident that our parent/teacher partnership will rest on the trust and communication needed to help us navigate through this coming school year. I am available and I welcome your communication and input.

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Flowers/Plants, Sharing & Show and Tell

Grace and courtesy and care of the environment are part of our day in a Montessori classroom. One way the children love to participate in this care is the opportunity we offer each week for a child to bring in fresh flowers to arrange for the classroom. Click here to access the e-signup sheet so you can pick the week for your child's flower delivery. Children are also invited to bring a potted plant as a way to care for the environment. If you would like for your child to participate, please assist him/her in bringing a hearty, low light, preferably indoor plant in a small pot that will fit on our shelves. This can be a great project for you and your child to do at home by personalizing the pot and decorating it prior to bringing the plant to school. We would appreciate it if you would write on an accompanying piece of paper the name of your child's plant along with its care instructions.

Please note that we would like to minimize what your child brings to school to necessary items only. We ask that toys, jewelry, and other "treasures" please be left at home; they tend to be distracting and loss or breakage of these items is upsetting to the children. Your child will, however, have a turn to participate in "show and tell" on a scheduled Friday and a note will be sent to you ahead of time with more details.

Birthdays

Your child's birthday is a special day for all of us and as a class we will acknowledge this special occasion by performing a Celebration of Life for your child with his or her peers and your family if you wish to be included. We ask that you send us non-returnable photos of your child for each year of your child's life (including an infant one) and that you email or call me a few weeks before your child's birthday to schedule the celebration. Please use U.S. mail to distribute birthday party invitations, gifts or thank-you notes to other children in class. You may request an updated address list from the office.

Weekly Communications & Transparent Classroom

As we move towards paperless communications, please make sure your most updated phone number is on file as well as your correct e-mail address with us and the office. We ask that you check it regularly, including your spam file; if you are not receiving regular emails please let us know. Every Friday, the office sends out a school-wide email communication with information on upcoming events and articles from each classroom. It is a great way to see what your child's class has been up to and also check out the older levels at school as well. Additionally, if your child produces paperwork, artwork, etc., he or she will bring those home in an envelope on Fridays. We ask that these envelopes be returned empty to school the following Monday.

Children working primarily on practical life and sensorial activities will not have a lot of work coming home in their folders, but this does not mean they have not been busy. You will also be receiving instructions via email to set up a personal family account and access your child's progress page through Transparent Classroom.

Transparent Classroom is an online program designed specifically for Montessori schools enabling you to see work and photos of your child along with a description of a number of lessons your child has received and some

ways you could extend the learning at home using Montessori principles.

Change of clothes

Please send in a full set of change of clothes for your child in a large Ziploc bag with your child's name printed on it. We appreciate that you label all the items belonging to your child.

In the Primary classroom, younger children's ability to use the restroom independently should not be hindered by tight clothing or those that are hard to manage; please make sure that your child's clothes are easy for him/her to

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put on and take off. Children are expected to be wearing underwear (not pull-ups or diapers) and please let us know if they need more reminders to use the restroom, as we will be happy to help with that.

Lunch, Snack & Water Bottles

Our goal is for your child to eat a filling, nutritious lunch in a peaceful, relaxing atmosphere. Please include a cloth placemat and napkin as well as any utensils your child may need, plus a small ice pack to help keep the food fresh. Please label these items with your child's name. We encourage packing high protein foods, and fresh fruit and vegetables rather than prepackaged and processed. Please pack lunch items in reusable containers that your child can easily open, including drink containers that do not leak or squirt when opened. We ask that you avoid Go-gurt and fruit roll-ups as they are very messy and encourage children to play with their food. Candy, chocolates, nuts/peanuts and soda are not allowed.

In addition to including a full lunch meal in your child's lunchbox, we ask that you add a daily snack for your child to eat when hungry during the work cycle. It is preferred that your child's snack is packed separately from their meal and contained in a specifically labeled container or re-usable bag. Please practice with your child opening and closing the lunchbox and any other containers prior to their coming to school to facilitate your child's independence.

We want your child to stay well hydrated throughout their time with us at school and ask that you provide your child with a labeled water bottle (preferably not a plastic disposable one) that can easily be used by your child. We have a hands-free filtered cold water station on the Primary playground and will help your child refill his or her bottle whenever needed.

Food Preparation

Because food preparation is an integral part of the Montessori's Practical Life curriculum, we plan this year on reintegrating it gradually into our classroom. After the first six weeks of school, parents will have the opportunity to donate ingredients for various baking and individual food preparation activities the children will partake in. More information will be communicated to you.

Medication & Sunscreen

If your child needs any type of medication during the school day, please contact the office as there is an authorization form for you to sign and complete before medication can be given. When a child is taking medication at home, please let us know as some medications can alter a child's day and we want to ensure the day is smooth.

We kindly ask that you apply sunscreen on your child prior to dropping him/her off at school and send your child with a hat to wear when playing outside.

Family Photo & Parent Questionnaire

Upon starting school, we will be working on a special art project that necessitates your help in providing me with a "family" photo. You can email me the photo directly or send a 6x4 print with your child's belongings by the first day of school.

Your child is unique and no one knows him or her better than you! As a way to better serve you this year, I would like to get your perspective on your child's growth so far and get to know more about your child (even if he/she is a returning student). I have attached to this letter a questionnaire to help you share with me the things your child loves, dislikes and laughs at. Please feel free to add any information you see pertinent to sharing with me. Do not hesitate to reach out via phone or email if you have any questions or thoughts for me. Again, welcome to the Center. I am looking forward to our days with you, your child, and your family.
